Title: Footprints of Fun

Proposal: Mural to be installed on the sidewalk in front of Chimney Park Pool entrance. The mural could be extended onto the sidewalks leading to the park.

Medium: Sherwin Williams Heavy Shield - a water-based concrete stain

Date Produced: TBD, ideally before winter

Price: \$25 per square foot



Maintenance Plan

Instructions

Inspect the mural annually, ideally after winter. High-level assessment to check the mural's condition and look for vandalism, graffiti, dirt/debris, growth of vegetation, paint issues, and physical damage to the mural. Take photos of the damage, and record how each issue was fixed. See below for recommended instructions regarding each issue.

A list of supplies used in the mural will be left with the appropriate parties. Along with a list of colors, how much paint was used, cost, and the application method.

General Cleaning

General cleaning can be done once a year, preferably in the springtime, after the last snow. A power washer can be used, starting at the lowest setting to ensure the paint is not removed from the sidewalk. Test a small area before cleaning the entire mural.

Paint Issues

To fix fading, chipped, or damaged paint, start by pressure washing the area on a low setting to remove dirt and debris. Allow the surface to dry for 24 hours. Once dry, apply the paint with a paintbrush or roller, depending on the area's size. Let the paint dry for at least 24 hours before allowing anyone to walk on the area.

Vegetation

Trim back weeds, unwanted plants, etc., growing on the mural surface and discard them. Gently clean the surface after removal.

Vandalism

To remove vandalism to the mural, such as graffiti, use a pressure washer at a high setting. If this does not remove it, a graffiti removal product can assist. If this removes some of the mural paint underneath the graffiti, allow the area to dry for 24 hours and touch up the area with the mural paint using a roller or brush, depending on the size of the impacted area. Allow the paint to dry for at least 24 hours.
