A. Call to Order- Meeting called to order at 6:06 by Carrie Nutt

1. Roll Call- In attendance: WAC members Carrie Nutt, Tiffany Bradshaw, Alex Block, Carol Clark, Laurie Bess, and Laura Browarny. Ken Bennett and Bobby Warner were also in attendance. Shelley Kawamura and Carolyn Snyder are absent this evening.
2. Review of the Agenda- The agenda was reviewed. No items of New Business were added for consideration by the board. Motion made by Laura Browarny and second made by Bobby Warner.

B. Consent Calendar

1. Approval of minutes from 5/17/22 Meeting: Carrie Nutt noted an error in the title of the minutes. Windsor Art Committee needs to be changed to Windsor Arts Commission.

D. Discussion Items

1. WAC Special Events subcommittee to report on planning for ART LIVE! Events through the remainder of the year.

The subcommittee reported that four events have been recommended including 4th of July, the Harvest Festival, Halloween, and Christmas. The subcommittee would like to include a live artist to create a piece of artwork (painting, chalk art, ice sculpture). This is intended to engage the community. The artwork would then be donated to a public facility with the WAC having rights to the imagery. The subcommittee will put out a call of artists. The subcommittee developed a logo/brand to promote these events.

2. Laura to present updates on the 408 Main Street Mural with the DDA and the updates on the new Police Station construction project.

a. Laura reported that she met with Josh from the DDA and owners of 408 Main and they are all in agreement that the project would be great. Laura and Josh discussed a partnership with financing the mural with the DDA. The mural subcommittee and Laura will meet with the property owner to discuss future plans for the project. The question was raised about maintenance and vandalism. Laura will check the policy

b. Laura met with the project manager of the Police Station project and the police chief. They are in the beginning stages of planning. They prefer outwork that would be outside of the new police station. Once they have a clear idea of what the outside will look like, she will meet with them again. The project will likely begin in 2024,

with a call for artists happening 2023. They did not discuss the financing of the project at this time, but it will likely be shared.

3. Discussion of other small cost-big impact options.

Laura proposed the WAC look for some small projects that could have a big impact in Windsor. She told the group about a project happening in the City of Golden. Artist are restricted to size (ie. 12" x 12"), and then they go into the city to find nooks, crannies, and other places to create artwork. It could be a great way to get people interested in public art and learning about the Town of Windsor. This of course would need to be in coordination with business owners and would need to follow all sign ordinances.

4. WAC Long-term Plan subcommittee to present updates and request support
No report at this time.

5. Schedule field trip to tour public art in Windsor.

Laura will send out a poll to WAC members of possible dates for tours.

6. Gateway Plan-

Laura spoke with Wade. The project will be in the long-range plan for next year.

Community Art Plan 2022-2026

2022 (\$75,000 budget)

- ART LIVE! Event series is launched to bring interactive art experiences to the community at various events.
 - Four events each year averaging \$2,000 per event
 - For 2022, this funding will be taken from the CIP budget associated with public art, but in future years it will be requested from the General Fund
- 408 Main St. Mural project
 - Old Town Windsor District
 - Identified historical and whimsical as top desired themes
 - To be completed in conjunction with the DDA
 - Goal is to complete by September 2022

2023 (\$100,000 proposed budget)

- Historic Halfway Homestead Project
 - Northwest Windsor District
 - Prefer historical, whimsical, educational
 - Prefer sculpture and infrastructure
 - Project budget is \$1.3 million
- Greeley #2 Ditch Trail Improvements
 - Trail connectivity project along 11th St.

2024

- Eastman Park River Experience Phase III
 - Southeast Windsor District
 - Trail opportunities, Treasure Island Garden, Bridges, River
- Windsor History Museum Interpretive Landscape/Eaton House Landscape
 - Northeast Windsor District
- 3rd St. Corridor Multimodal Transportation improvements
 - Bike and pedestrian trail connections and improvements from Main St. to Eastman Park Drive
 - Old Town Windsor District
- New Police Station
 - Northwest Windsor District
 - Discussions with the Police Chief and head architect for the project have begun.
 - Chief is interested in entryway artwork

 - New neighborhood park located on north side of Windsor Lake
 - Northeast Windsor District
